O God, help us never to forget your gifts.

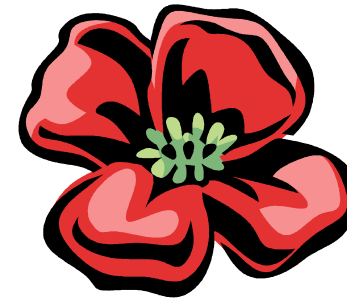
Lord Jesus Christ, you said that people have no greater love
