There have already been some ideas brought forward that will be mentioned as examples. We would love to have engagement from as many people as possible as we decide on the next steps. We will also be preparing a survey as an additional way for people to give feedback. This is an incredibly exciting place to be, poised on the edge of new ideas that people feel passionate about.
