# Financial Up-date to October 31, 2024

With less than two months to the end of the fiscal year for the Kirk, the following is provided to draw attention to the financial status of the Kirk's Operating Account. As of the end of October there was a year-to-date deficit of \$43,469. The following chart outlines the revenue required by December 31st to avoid a deficit at year's end.

It is expected that PAR and Rentals will achieve or exceed the budgeted amounts for the year and the Loose Offerings budget has already been surpassed.

Expenditures to the end of October totaled \$245,422 and based on the approved budget of \$297,058 it is estimated that the expenditures for the year will be within the budgeted total.
