Soup Kitchen Volunteers Needed

While we very much appreciate and thank the regular volunteers for serving at the Soup Kitchen, we are looking to recruit more members of the congregation. Some details are: We cook the first Saturday of every month except in July and August. The meal is the same every month - potatoes, ground beef with gravy and mixed peas, corn and carrots. The food is picked up and dropped off by Michele Halliwell the day before and Amy drops off the cookies. You would arrive by 9:00 a.m. (or before if possible) to cook the potatoes (they have them peeled), cook the meat, make the gravy mix and heat the frozen vegetables. While things are cooking, the trays are made up with utensils, napkins, cookies, etc.... The doors open at 10:30 for the clients to enter and close at 11:50. After the clients leave, there will be some clean-up to do with the goal of finishing around 12 p.m. There are two staff members present who can assist if needed.
