No one chooses to be a refugee; however, today there are over 42 million refugees and many more who are internally displaced—forced to leave their homes due to conflicts or ethnic persecution. PWS&D's refugee ministry responds to Christ's call to serve and defend those who are persecuted. Churches continue to demonstrate their support by sponsoring refugee families, helping them rebuild their lives safely and with dignity. In 2025, 61 sponsored refugees arrived from 8 countries, including Iraq, Sudan, and Afghanistan. This ministry is not only about offering hope but also about living out the biblical call to love and serve others, showing Christ's love to those who are experiencing persecution and suffering.

### International Ministries, Missionary to Nepal

Appointed by the Presbyterian Church in Canada, the Rev. Lora Nafziger serves as Staff Care and Counselling Advisor in Nepal, working with a long-standing Presbyterian Church in Canada partner, the United Mission to Nepal (UMN), UMN is a faith-based international NGO that strives to help all Nepalis achieve a fuller life through medical and community development programs. Stationed in Kathmandu, Lora provides spiritual care and emotional support to expatriate staff and their families when they are making the initial transition to life in Nepal, and once they have arrived, continues to offer pastoral and mental health care and support. Lora meets individually with expatriate and Nepali staff for counselling and spiritual direction, plans retreats, offers hospitality in her home, provides resources and supports people in times of crisis or major discernment. Lora has been serving in Nepal since 2024 with her spouse Mitch Rhodes, UMN's Expatriate Coordinator, and their two younger children.
